3. School Report Card - RISE Scores

- English learner progress
- TSI school, for students with disabilities 2018. Subgroup performing in lowest 5%. 2022 students with disabilities did score above and exited out of TSI school. This is a great achievement.
- Other subgroup ELL English Language Learners low proficiency test scores
- Hired an ELL aide that works with ELL students
- Small group of students, how to address their needs
- Want to see more adequate progress as well as increase proficiency. This will be an area of focus

4. Halloween Parade

- Parade was great
- Line bent around, more spaces for parents to see the students
- 6th grade made up rotation time
- Trying the best to make it fair for all rotation time

5. Teacher support for progress monitoring

- School is starting to hire an aide for every grade level, found money from TSSA budget
- 1st grade aide has been hired 17 hours/week. Grade teams decide how the aide time is spent for progress monitoring or other items
- It is the best for teachers to progress monitor their own students but it take a lot of time

6. Progress Toward goals

- Grade level extensions report
- Principal and Mrs. Cami Anderson meeting with each grade level, discussed high level students and how to do extensions for them. There is not as much information and training available for helping high level learners.
- Teachers are committed to getting a years growth for all students
- In the past a math and stem specialist would come and do extensions with smaller groups
- South Jordan as a school has a majority of high level learners, how do we help the majority to increase not just do things for small groups

- Walk to math (5th grade) and walk to read is an opportunity to do different ways of learning for groups. 5th grade using PLCs to plan and do different ways of learning.
 Possibility to use the grade level aide to help with group sizes.
- Teachers take turns teaching different levels for walk to read
- Walk to read allows for more targeted instruction

7. Safe Technology & Digital Citizenship Plan

- SCC needs to make sure that there is a plan in place
- Jordan School District has a district wide form, this is what we do as a school for digital citizenship, online student safety and need an online filtering system on
- NetSmarts, lost funding
- White Ribbon Week is all about Digital Citizenship and internet safety
- Mini lesson everyday for the week and then assembly at the end
- Find a group to come and talk to the students during White Ribbon Week
- Computer lab teaches digital safety in the first few weeks of school
- LANschool, Teachers can see what students are doing on their chromebooks on their computers
